

#### **Catering Conditions**

Standard catering according the day time with hot and cold drinks. Standard catering describes: Continental breakfast set in the morning with sliced fruits and juice. All other daytime, sliced fruits and a sandwich meal set or mixed canapés will be served. Hot drinks are defined as coffee and different sorts of tea. Cold drinks are defined as Coca Cola, Coca Cola light or Zero, Sprite, Fanta, water sparkling and non-sparkling, beer, white wine and red wine and a small bottle of champagne. If other catering, drinks or brands are required than stated above, kindly ask our operations team. An additional charge will apply.

#### Pax Conditions

For each additional passenger, other than in this contract, we charge 100€ on top for passenger fee, customs and catering. If there are less passengers flying than stated in this contract, the refund can only be done if the correction will be performed 24h before the contracted departure time.

#### **Pet Conditions**

For each dog/cat/pet that was not considered before, we charge an additional 100€ cleaning fee. For each dog/cat/pet inbound Great Britain, we need the dog/cat/pet details 24h before departure mandatory and each dog/cat/pet will be charged with 200€ customs fee, if not calculated before. These 200€ are for customs and cleaning fee in total.

#### De-Icing and Weather Conditions

The charter price does not include any aircraft de-icing cost or alternatively any hangar costs. These costs will be charged separately according the third-party invoice plus a 10% handling surcharge of Excellent Air GmbH. Confirmation depends on necessary traffic rights, weather and airport slots/opening hours. Should a diversion be necessary due to weather or safety reason (captain's decision) the cost will be charged separately on top without any surcharge. Airports that are subject to weather, need a defined alternate before.

#### Cargo Conditions

Please be kindly informed, that we calculate 44lbs luggage per passenger. If the luggage differs from this value, we need as soon as possible the real value to check if the transportation is still possible. If this is not performed before, there is a risk that not all luggage can be taken with the aircraft. The additional charge to transport the luggage will be applied to the broker / passenger.

#### Late Arrival Conditions

Please be kindly informed, we plan for our Jets multiple legs per day. If passengers do not show up at the departure airport 30 minutes after contracted departure time, the operator has the right to depart on the contracted departure airport without the passengers, unless the operator is previously informed about the delay and accept it. Otherwise the additional compensation fees for the next charter must bepaid.

#### **AOG Terms**

In case of an AOG, Excellent Air will try to use one of their Backup Aircrafts, which are CJ2s. If this is not possible, we try to organize a Sub-Charter from the freemarket.



#### Terms of Payment

100% of the charter price must be paid 48h prior departure. Short term bookings of charter flights less than 48 hours prior ETD, 100% of the charter flight must be paid immediately by flight confirmation. In any case, we need the credit card details to block the amount until the invoice is fully paid. Otherwise the flight will not be performed. VAT, where legally necessary, will be charged on top of the net charter quote.

#### Cancellation fees

After the charter-contract has been confirmed in writing, a minimum 20% of the total charter charter price is non- refundable. 72 hours prior to ETD (departure), a cancellation fee of 50% of the total charter price will apply. 24 hours prior to ETD, 100% of the total charter price must be paid as the cancellation fee.

#### Forbidden Items

All electronic devices of the series "Samsung Galaxy Note 7" are strictly forbidden to be brought into the cabin or to be carried in any luggage which will be loaded into the aircraft.
